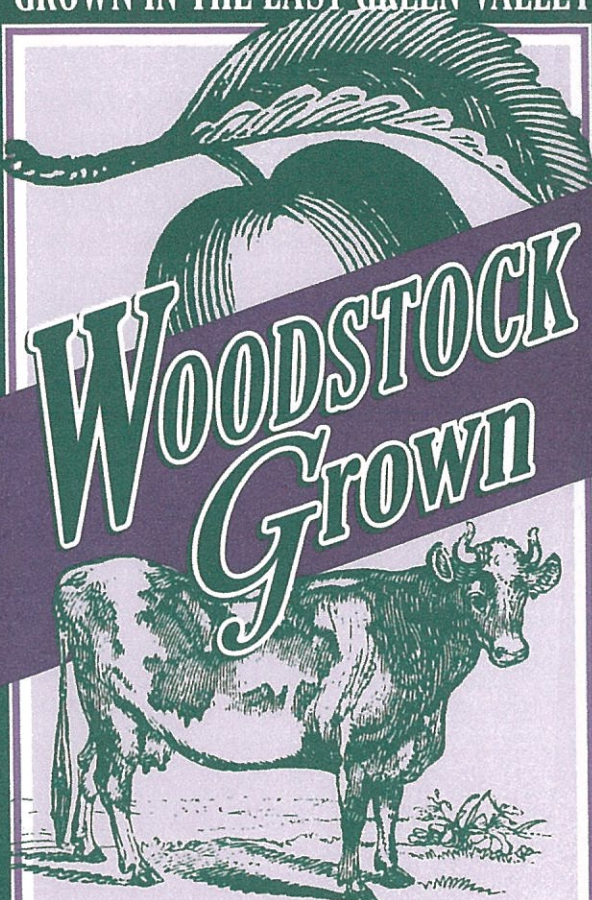

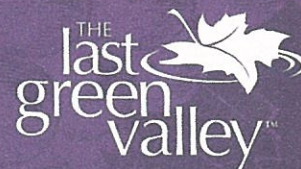
**Woodstock,** Connecticut is one of 35 Towns located in The Last Green Valley, National Heritage Corridor. The working farms of Woodstock are a main reason that the guidebook, 1,000 Places to See Before You Die, cites Woodstock as possessing "tranquility, history and pastoral good looks." *Woodstock was one of the first Towns in CT to pass a local Right-to-Farm ordinance, demonstrating its commitment to its working landscape, which provide jobs, fresh food, and beautiful views.*

Woodstock is home to **Celebrating Agriculture**, held annually on the fourth Saturday of September at the Woodstock Fairgrounds.
