25 Route 197 - Diversion of Rain Runoff

05/01/24

Dear IWWA Members:

On April 23, I met Rocco Addeo on site to discuss a diversion solution for rain runoff that crosses the Meadowside Campground driveway. The proposed work area is within 125 ft of a pond (see GIS depiction).

I observed that rain runoff has eroded a trough across the driveway to an established channel along the western side of the driveway. Piping was proposed in the location of the trough following current contours.

Rip-rap was proposed to assist infiltration and prevent erosion within a pooling area at the north-east inlet of the trough and may also be appropriate at the western outlet to control any velocity increase from piping.

The placement of rip rap and piping to a defined channel may help to prevent erosion and improve the conservation of soil and water; it may also provide relief and less disturbance from recurring road repairs.
