In order to save on referendum costs, traditional town meetings will return in 2024. This means that votes on matters listed in the Agenda will be taken in person and decisions made at the meeting. It is important to have as many Woodstock Residents attend these meetings as possible.

OWN BUDGET 101

In December/January each year the Board of Education and Board of Selectmen begin their perspective meetings to formulate their budgets for the upcoming fiscal year. Our fiscal year runs from July 1st thru June 30th. This is a long process that is comprised of many public meetings.

WOODSTOCK BUDGET BASICS

The total annual budget is split between the General and Education budgets. Approximately 80% of total budget amount goes towards education costs.

Woodstack budget relies on the annual Grand List numbers to determine the mil (tax) rate. The Grand List is comprised of all Real Estate, Personal Property and Motor Vehicle Values.
