INFORMATION FROM YOUR WOODSTOCK CT REGISTRARS

Early Voting has come to Connecticut!

Starting with the Presidential Preferred Primary, early voting was held for four days: Tuesday March 26, Wednesday March 27, Thursday March 28, and Saturday March 30, from 10 am to 6 pm every day.

May 13th is the last day that a citizen enrolled in a specific political party can transfer to another party and still vote in the August primary.

July 26th is the last day people can register as an elector by mail and still vote in the August primary.

On **July 30th** there will be an enrollment session offered by Woodstock's registrars. This means that we will be in our office to accept in person registrations for two hours that day. The hours will be shared via various communication channels in the week before.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS- 2024 VOTE DAYS

The 2024 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY will be held on **Tuesday, April 2, 2024** at Woodstock Middle School in the Gymnasium from 6 am to 8 pm.

The town referendum will be held at the town hall in May (tentative date of May 21st) following the town meeting.

The primary for state and federal senators and representatives will be at the WMS gymnasium on **Tuesday, August 13th** from 6 am to 8 pm.

OWN BUDGET 10

In December/January each year the Board of Education and Board of Selectmen begin their perspective meetings to formulate their budgets for the upcoming fiscat year. Our fiscal year runs from July 1st thru June 30th. This is a long process that is comprised of many public meetings.

WOODSTOCK BUDGET BASICS

The total annual budget is split between the General and Education budgets. Approximately 80% of total budget amount goes towards

Woodstock budget relies on the annual Grand List numbers to determine the mil (tax) rate. The Grand List is comprised of all Real Estate, Personal Property and Motor Vehicle Values.

The proposed General Government Budget and proposed Board of Education Budget were presented to the Board of Finance on Tuesday. March 12th. Details about the initial proposed budgets can be found in the BOF Minutes on the Town Website.

Total proposed General Government FY 25 Budget amount is \$6,432,672 Total proposed Education FY 25 Budget amount is \$23,396,128

Expected Revenues were presented and both General Government & Education budgets reviewed at the Board of Finance on Tuesday, March 19th. Details about the estimated revenues can be found in the BOF Minutes on the Town Website.

Current estimated revenues for FY 25 is \$28,546,522. *This number is subject to change.

The public has the option to voice their opinions on the FY 25 budget at the Board of Finance Public Hearing on April 9th. The Board of Finance will meet to discuss and finalize the FY 25 Budget amount on April 16th.

POET LAUREATE COMMITTEE

The newest town committee met for the first time on March 5th. The committee is tasked with selecting a Poet Laureate for Woodstock, CT.

A poet laureate is a poet officially appointed by a government or conferring institution, typically expected to compose poems for special events and occasions. This is a new position for the Town of Woodstock approved by the Board of Selectmen earlier this year.

COMMITTEE ON AGING

The Committee on Aging has created a Senior Resource brochure and is discussing the best way to distribute it and other information to the public. Finding the best way to distribute information to our senior residents is a challenge yet to be determined. They also are discussing options surrounding AARP services.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission voted to continue with virtual meetings at this time. The Commission plans to focus on dirt roads in Woodstock, specifically erosion and preservation as the next topic for consideration.

WHAT'S HAPPENING

BOARD OF SELECTMEN

The Board of Selectmen met several times in March to address the FY 25 Budget. Reductions were made to proposals in the amount of \$146,032 resulting in a total FY 25 General Budget in the amount of \$6,432,672 a 3.42% increase including debt service.

In addition to the planned bridge work on Peake Brook & County Roads starting this spring, the federal program plans to start the process for Kenyonville Road bridge work.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

A reminder that fees have been updated as of April 2024 in the Building Department.

New permit rate of \$13.26 per thousand of estimated cost with minimum fee of \$35.26. Fee rates for new construction are now \$.97 per sq. ft., decks & porches are now \$.34 per sq. ft. and barns, sheds & garages are now \$.28 per sq. ft.

Flat fees for Demo is now \$50, above ground pool is now \$75 and inground pool is now \$150.
